

History of Dorr Township



The Township of Dorr was established in 1847, with Frank Neuman being the first settler on the site of what was to become the village of Dorr. He built the first framed house in 1857. After the first railroad was laid in 1869, Neuman traveled to the county seat of Allegan, surveyed and laid out the original village plat of Dorr. The name of Dorr was selected at the suggestion of a settler from Rhode Island. He proposed the township be named after the principal in Dorr's (Rhode Island) Rebellion.

By the year 1880, Dorr had a population of 200. The village has never been incorporated and continues to be governed by an elected township board.

The prosperity of the town has fluctuated through the years. In its "boomtown" days, Dorr boasted of many businesses and industries. The villagers

were very proud of their two hotels, "The National Hotel" and the "Birney House" which was across the street near the location of the present Dorr Industries. The first grocery store was opened by Joseph Neuman and it's believed to have been located in the Frary house directly across the street from the former library and town hall. A general store owned by John DeJonge and George Clouse was once located at the present site of AJ's Bar and Grill.



Today there are nearly three hundred (300) active Downtown

Development Authorities throughout Michigan.

DDA's are enabled by Public Act 197 of 1975, as amended and operate as special purpose authorities appointed by local governing bodies to carry out specific tasks. These include the planning and improvement of downtown areas through the construction of a broad range of eligible public facilities (e.g., streetscape, utilities, parks, landscaping, pathways etc.) and

assistance to developers in the improvement of real estate within the DDA's Development Area. The DDA is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of the Township Supervisor (supervisor@dorrtownship.org) and eight (8) other members appointed by the Supervisor with the approval of the Township Board of Trustees. The DDA is a public body and must conduct itself in accordance with all of the Michigan Statutes governing the operation of public agencies.

The meetings start at 6:00 p.m. at the Township Complex. 2021 dates are: 2nd Monday of January, March, May, July, September, and November

Allegan County Senior Services

ADULT DAY CARE

Daytime care of any part of a day but less than 24-hour care for functionally and/or cognitively impaired elderly persons provided through a structured program of social and rehabilitative and/or maintenance services in a supportive group setting other than the client's home. Generations Adult Day Care—Monday-Friday from 7 am - 6 pm.

HOME DELIVERED MEALS

The provision of nutritious meals to homebound older persons. Community Action of Allegan County (CAAC)

IN-HOME SUPPORT SERVICES

In home supports services may consist of any combination of the following tasks and duties based on the needs and wishes of the client and his/her caregiver: homemaking and performance of routine household tasks necessary to maintain an adequate living environment for older individuals with functional limitations such as laundry, ironing, meal preparation, shopping and errands, light housekeeping, and personal care.

IN HOME RESPITE

Respite care includes companionship, supervision, and assistance to mentally or physically disabled, and frail elderly persons in the absence of their primary caregiver. In-home supports services may also include supervising the care of the client by reminding, prompting, cuing, and frequently directing the activities of daily living. Provider Alliance Home Health Care Services (primary provider) covers the entire county, and Evergreen Commons covers the west side of the county. Alliance Home Health Care Services; Care Services of Evergreen.

PERSONAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEMS

Personal Emergency Response Systems (PERS) for the frailest seniors with no informal support system in place (family, friends, etc.). Clients must meet the following eligibility criteria: The client must be oriented and in possession of faculties to absorb training in the equipment, and be able to operate the button appropriately. The client must be homebound for "a no cost to you" PERS unit OR at least 2 of the following: fallen at least once in the 90 days, has been hospitalized in the last 90 days, lives alone with NO family contact.

TRANSPORTATION

Seniors who are no longer driving can access this service for medical and legal appointments, grocery shopping, and errands. Depending on the mobility level of the senior, service can be provided on a wheelchair-friendly bus or with a volunteer driver. Door-to-door service is provided by volunteer drivers. Please call 1 week in advance. Provider Volunteer Transportation is provided through both Community Action of Allegan County (CAAC) and Allegan County Senior Services. Bus transportation is provided through Allegan County Transportation.

OUTREACH AND ASSISTANCE

The Outreach and Assistance program is offered as a direct service of the Allegan County Department of Senior Services. The Outreach and Assistance Coordinator is available Monday-Thursday, 9 am to 3 pm by appointment only to assist seniors and their caregivers with: coordinating services available throughout the county, assistance with completing paperwork for government assistance, insurance, etc.. Medicare Part D (cost savings) counseling
