


History of Dorr Township



The Township of Dorr was established in 1847, with Frank Neuman recognized as the first settler on the site that would become the village of Dorr. In 1857, Neuman built the area's first framed house. After the first railroad was laid in 1869, he traveled to Allegan—the county seat—to survey and lay out the original village plat of Dorr.

The name “Dorr” was chosen at the suggestion of a settler from Rhode Island, who proposed naming the township after Thomas Wilson Dorr, the leader of *Dorr's Rebellion* in Rhode Island.

By 1880, Dorr's population had reached about 200 residents. The village was never incorporated and continues to be governed by an elected township board to this day.

Over the years, Dorr's prosperity has risen and fallen. During its “boom-town” era, it was home to many businesses and industries. The residents took pride in their two hotels—the National Hotel and the Birney House, the latter located near the present

site of Dorr Industries.

The first grocery store, opened by Joseph Neuman, is believed to have been located in the Frary House, across the street from the former library and town hall. A general store operated by John DeJonge and George Clouse once stood at the present site of OMG Restaurant.





The Dorr Township Library is located at the southwest corner of 18th Street and Sunset Drive, just north of the George Wagner American Legion Post 127. The Dorr Township Library provides free services to all residents living within the Dorr Township boundaries with services also available to residents of the Lakeland Library Cooperative.

The library system holds over 27,400 materials including over 24,000 print materials, and 1,700 compact discs and DVDs.


Development Authorities throughout Michigan.

DDA's are enabled by Public Act 197 of 1975, as amended and operate as special purpose authorities appointed by local governing bodies to carry out specific tasks. These include the planning and improvement of downtown areas through the construction of a broad range of eligible public facilities (e.g., streetscape, utilities, parks, landscaping, pathways etc.) and

assistance to developers in the improvement of real estate within the DDA's Development Area. The DDA is governed by a Board of Directors consisting of the Township Supervisor (supervisor@dorrtownship.org) and eight (8) other members appointed by the Supervisor with the approval of the Township Board of Trustees. The DDA is a public body and must conduct itself in accordance with all of the Michigan Statutes governing the operation of public agencies.

The meetings start at 6:00 p.m. at the Township Complex. 2021 dates are: 2nd Monday of January, March, May, July, September, and November

Bysterveld County Park encompasses a beautiful 70-acre parcel of natural area generously donated to the County by the late John and Josie Bysterveld. Construction on Phase I of the park was completed in the spring of 2006 and includes two miles of nature trails, a picnic shelter, a playground, a catch and release fishing pond, a grass picnic/recreation area, a restroom facility, and parking for 75 vehicles. All of these amenities are ADA accessible. There are many splendid natural features that can be found on the park property, including rolling hills, wet meadows, wetlands, and woodland areas. Allegan County Senior Services

ADULT DAY CARE

Daytime care of any part of a day but less than 24-hour care for functionally and/or cognitively impaired elderly persons provided through a structured program of social and rehabilitative and/or maintenance services in a supportive group setting other than the client's home. Generations Adult Day Care—Monday-Friday from 7 am - 6 pm.

HOME DELIVERED MEALS

The provision of nutritious meals to homebound older persons. Community Action of Allegan County (CAAC)

IN-HOME SUPPORT SERVICES

In home supports services may consist of any combination of the following tasks and duties based on the needs and wishes of the client and his/her caregiver: homemaking and performance of routine household tasks necessary to maintain an adequate living environment for older individuals with functional limitations such as laundry, ironing, meal preparation, shopping and errands, light housekeeping, and personal care.

IN HOME RESPITE

Respite care includes companionship, supervision, and assistance to mentally or physically disabled, and frail elderly persons in the absence of their primary caregiver. In-home supports services may also include supervising the care of the client by reminding, prompting, cuing, and frequently directing the activities of daily living. Provider Alliance Home Health Care Services (primary provider) covers the entire county, and Evergreen Commons covers the west side of the county. Alliance Home Health Care Services; Care Services of Evergreen.

PERSONAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEMS

Personal Emergency Response Systems (PERS) for the frailest seniors with no informal support system in place (family, friends, etc.). Clients must meet the following eligibility criteria: The client must be oriented and in possession of faculties to absorb training in the equipment, and be able to operate the button appropriately. The client must be homebound for “a no cost to you” PERS unit OR at least 2 of the following: fallen at least once in the 90 days, has been hospitalized in the last 90 days, lives alone with NO family contact.

TRANSPORTATION

Seniors who are no longer driving can access this service for medical and legal appointments, grocery shopping, and errands. Depending on the mobility level of the senior, service can be provided on a wheelchair-friendly bus or with a volunteer driver. Door-to-door service is provided by volunteer drivers. Please call 1 week in advance. Provider Volunteer Transportation is provided through both Community Action of Allegan County (CAAC) and Allegan County Senior Services. Bus transportation is provided through Allegan County Transportation.

OUTREACH AND ASSISTANCE

The Outreach and Assistance program is offered as a direct service of the Allegan County Department of Senior Services. The Outreach and Assistance Coordinator is available Monday-Thursday, 9 am to 3 pm by appointment only to assist seniors and their caregivers with: coordinating services available throughout the county, assistance with completing paperwork for government assistance, insurance, etc.. Medicare Part D (cost savings) counseling
